
### **Chapter 5:Creating Webpage Using HTML**

#### **Inserting Images:**


You have seen the webpages with lot of pictures. You can also add pictures in a webpage.

To insert a picture in a webpage, type the tag <IMG> with the attribute SRC as <IMG SRC="image file with complete path">.

For example:<IMG SRC="D:\WALLPAPERS\Flower.JPEG">


## **SETTING IMAGE AS THE BACKGROUND**

Instead of colour, you can use an image as the background of the webpage.

To set an image as the background, type the tag <BODY> with the attribute BACKGROUND whose value is the complete path of the image as


<BODY BACKGROUND="image file with complete path">.

For Example:<BODY BACKGROUND="D:\WALLPAPERS\FLOWER.JPG">

## **CREATING LIST:**

Lists make your webpage more readable and attractive. The most common HTML lists are Ordered List and Unordered List.

### **Ordered List:**

An Ordered List is a numbered list. It starts with the **<OL>** tag. Each list item starts with **<LI>** tag.


To add the numbered list in your webpage, do the following:

1. Type the tag **<OL>**
2. Type the tag **<LI>** and then type the items for the list.  
Repeat this step for other list items.
3. Type the closing tag **</OL>**.




### **Unordered List:**

An Unordered list is a bulleted list. It starts with **<UL>** tag. Each list item starts with **<LI>** tag.


To add the bulleted list in your webpage, do the following:

- 2.Type the tag **<Li>** and then type the items for the list.
- 3.Type the closing tag **</UL>**.

## **CREATING TABLES:**


Tables are used to store the data in rows and columns. In HTML, tables are created with the **<TABLE>** tag. To add data in each row, **<TD>** tag is used.

To add a table in your webpage, do the following:

- 1.Type the **<TABLE>**.
- 2.Type the tag**<TR>**.
- 3.Type the tag**<TD>**,Type the text.
- 4.Type the closing tag**</TD>**.
- 5.Repeat step-3 and step-4 to add more columns.
- 6.Type the closing tag**</TR>**.


Repeat step-2 to step-5 to add data to the rows.

- 7.Type the closing tag**</TABLE>**.

## **HYPERLINKS:**


Hyperlinks are the links in a webpage, which on clicking, take you to some other location of the website or the webpage. A link is a pointer from one document to the other document(destination document).

In HTML, the `<A>` tag is used to insert hyperlink. This tag is called the anchor tag. the `HREF` attribute is used to set the location or URL of the destination page or site. The text between the opening and closing anchor tag becomes the hypertext or link text.

To add hyperlinks, do the following:

1. Type the tag `<A>` with the attribute `HREF` as `<A HREF="location">`.
2. Type the link text.
3. Type the closing tag `</A>`.

For example: `<A HREF="D:\WALLPAPERS\CUTE>JPG"> click here</A>`


